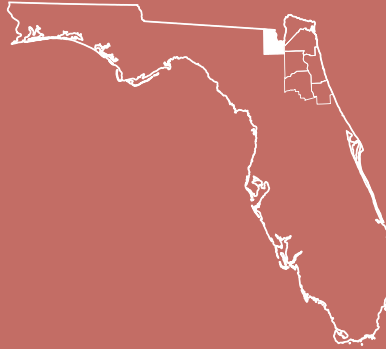


# *Where to Hang Your Hat:* ***Finding the Perfect Neighborhood***



You're in luck when starting the search for your new home because the First Coast has a plethora of neighborhoods to explore for your perfect home. To help you navigate this large region, we have put together descriptions of many different neighborhoods in the five First Coast counties of Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns. Each of these areas has their own unique treasures whether you are looking for a brand new home in a master-planned community, a historic home on a gorgeous street lined by trees covered in Spanish moss, a luxury condominium, or a beach bungalow, there are many styles of homes to choose from.

# Baker County

Has a quaint country atmosphere with all the conveniences of being close to the big city. In the last year, Baker County has grown by 2.93 percent, which could partially be because downtown Jacksonville is a quick 20-minute drive, giving residents the ability to easily commute into the city. Osceola National Forest falls within the county's boundaries and is a true Florida gem. The area has been preserved by the beauty of old Florida full of woodlands and swamps that give both residents and visitors opportunities for camping, hiking and more—truly getting to experience the beauty that the area holds.

## GLEN ST. MARY/ MACCLENNY

If you are looking for a slower paced small-town atmosphere, Glen St. Mary and Macclenny could be the perfect place to call home. Currently, 460 people call Glen St. Mary home, with additional residents in the area including the city of Macclenny, which is a quick five-minute drive down the road from Glen St. Mary. Whether you are looking for a single-family home, gated community or even a property with sprawling acreage where you can own horses, Glen St. Mary

may be the perfect place for you. Macclenny stands as the county seat of Baker County and was established in 1890. The original trade of the area was timber, with sawmills built along rivers and waterways. This was the perfect way for lumber to be transported. Now the town has a population of about 6,700 residents and is located a quick 35 miles from Jacksonville and six miles from the Georgia border. This city provides residents with subdivisions that offer single-family homes, apartment complexes and townhomes.

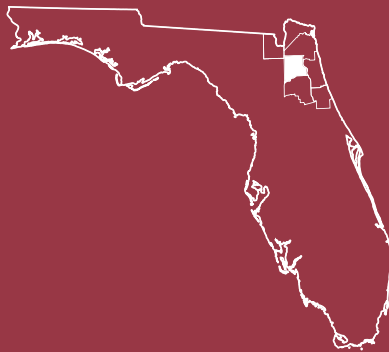

# Clay County

Located southwest of Jacksonville and west of historic St. Augustine, much of Clay County is rural and consists of farms connected by country roads. The area was founded more than 160 years ago and was a popular destination for tourists because of its mild climate and springs. The population of the area has grown 1.53 percent in the last year, bringing in a mix of suburban neighborhoods as well as up-and-coming communities into the rural atmosphere.

## FLEMING ISLAND

Fleming Island is a thriving residential and commercial area full of life. The area has major developments including Eagle Harbor, Fleming Island Plantation and Pace Island as well as a bustling commercial area filled with shopping centers, entertainment and restaurants. For nature lovers, Black Creek Park located on the south side of Fleming Island borders Black Creek, which is

full of nature trails for both hikers and bikers.

## GREEN COVE SPRINGS

Green Cove Springs was established in 1854 as White Sulfur Springs, eventually changing to Green Cove Springs in 1866. Today, these natural sulfur springs flow into the St. Johns River where many older homes line the river. Recently, the town has also had an arrival of new housing developments, but also has housing

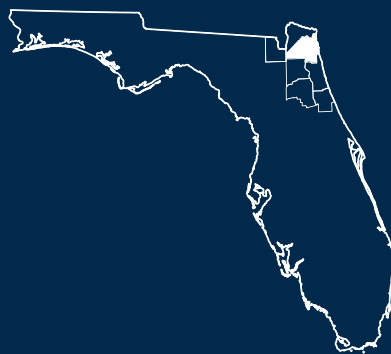

The area is also bordered on the south by Julington Creek and the St. Johns River to the west.

# Good-to-Know Info

If you're not only new to the First Coast, but to the state of Florida as well, check out this list of good-to-know information for car and homeowners.

## Car Insurance

The mandatory minimum coverage for a registered motor vehicle is a \$10,000 personal injury protection (PIP) policy and a \$10,000 property damage liability (PDL) policy. The minimum coverage applies to all vehicles registered in the state of Florida, even if the vehicle is inoperable. ## Driver's License and Motor Vehicles

Within 10 days of becoming employed, placing a child in public school or establishing residency in Florida, vehicles registered out of state are required to be registered in Florida and have a Florida license plate, a registration certificate and registration decal. You must apply for a Florida driver's license within 30 days of establishing residency in Florida to avoid fines and penalties. Visit [www.flhsmv.gov](http://www.flhsmv.gov) for more info.

## Property Taxes and Homestead Exemption

On the First Coast, property taxes are due in March and are considered delinquent as of April 1. Discounts are given for property taxes paid in advance. The maximum discount offered is 3 percent and applies to taxes paid in November. Late taxes are subject to penalty. See our list of tax collector's offices on this page.

Legal Florida residents who own and reside on property are eligible for a homestead exemption up to \$50,000. This exemption applies to the first and third \$25,000 of the assessed value of the primary residence. The first \$25,000 applies to all property taxes, including school district taxes. The second exemption applies to assessed value over \$50,000 and only to non-school taxes. To be eligible, you must own and occupy your home as your permanent residence on January 1. The deadline to file is March 1. To apply for the exemption, go to your local Property Appraiser's office.

## Termite Protection Contract

It's important for First Coast homeowners to be aware of the potential damage caused by termites, which are common throughout the state of Florida. When a pest control company completes a termite protection treatment, they must issue a termite protection contract. This contract is valid for a year and can be renewed up to four additional years. For new homes, the contract must include a warranty or guarantee that covers retreatment of the termite infested area if one occurs within one year of treatment, according to Florida law. If buying an older home, it is recommended, but not mandatory, to have a termite inspection and obtain a termite contract. 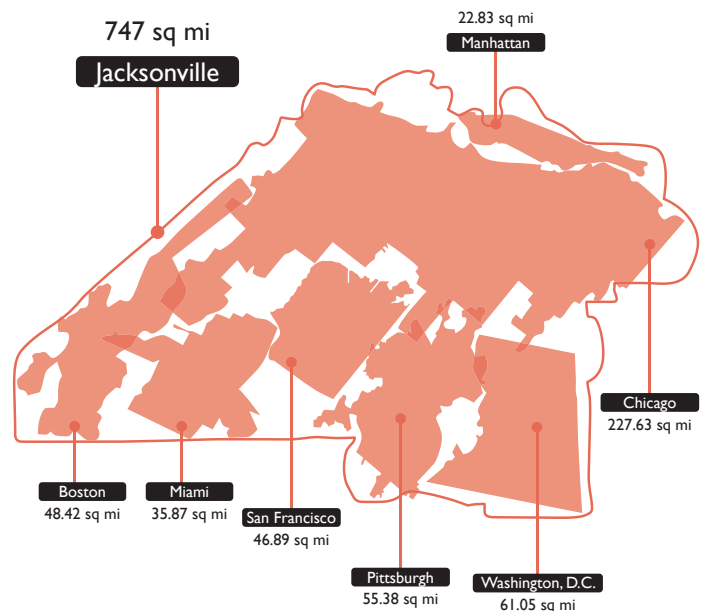

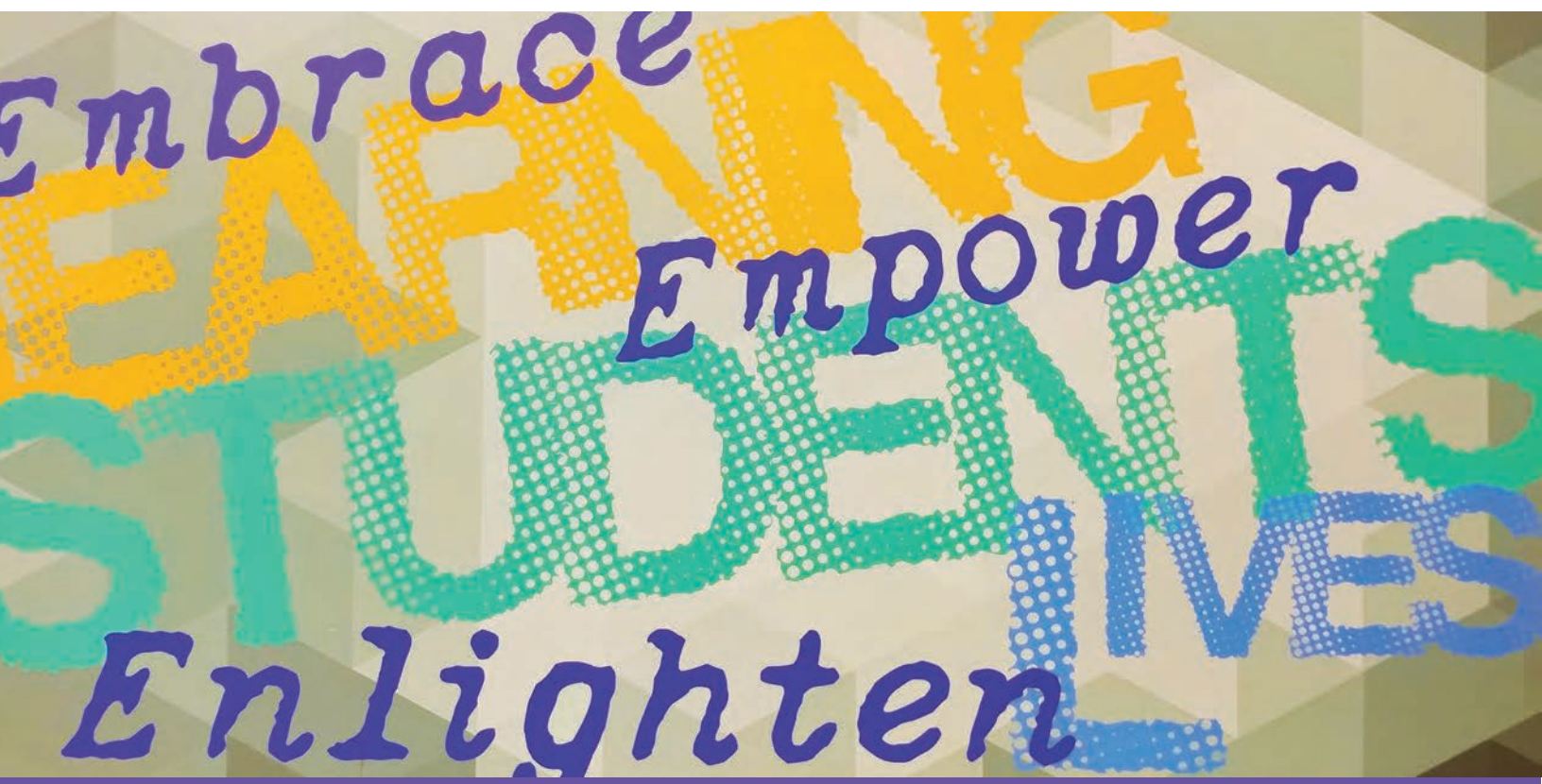

## UF Health

UF Health, affiliated with the University of Florida Health Science Center Jacksonville, is proud to serve Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia residents as the region's premier academic health center. Traveling down I-95 through Jacksonville from the Georgia state line to St. Augustine takes you close to UF Health medical facilities.

The four medical campuses are UF Health Jacksonville in downtown Jacksonville, UF Health North near Jacksonville International Airport, UF Health Emerson Medical Plaza on the south side of Jacksonville and UF Health Wildlight in Yulee. These encompass more than 60 practices throughout the area offering primary and specialty care services.

UF Health Jacksonville is a full-service hospital and home to the only Level I trauma program in the area, 24/7 emergency room and Level III

neonatal intensive care unit. Some specialty care services on site are cardiology, obstetrics and gynecology, neurosurgery, orthopaedics, rehabilitation services and many more. The University of Florida Colleges of Medicine, Nursing and Pharmacy are also located on the UF Health Jacksonville campus.

UF Health North is home to the only full-service hospital in North Florida, a 24/7 emergency room, and 12 state-of-the-art labor and delivery suites. Also on this campus is the Medical

Office Building, offering more than 30 specialty services including outpatient surgery, laboratory and diagnostic services.

UF Health Emerson Medical Plaza is home to a multiservice outpatient care center. Rehabilitation services offers physical, speech, occupational and neurological therapies. A variety of additional specialties are available, from cardiology and neurosciences to endocrinology and imaging services. As well as primary care and health screening services.

UF Health Wildlight is the newest outpatient medical facility, which opened in December 2019 and is the official medical provider for the Wildlight Community. ## Navigating Senior Living Options

**Seniors on the First Coast have many living options to choose from! When making a selection, it is important to know the differences between them to find the best fit.**

### Assisted Living Facilities

Assisted living facilities are a long-term care option for seniors who need help with daily care but still have some independence. Trained staff are there to help with tasks such as bathing, getting dressed, managing medications and grooming. These facilities are often structured like apartments and offer supervision, meals, activities and other amenities. There are often large common areas and dining rooms for seniors to socialize. Residents also have access to nursing services, with a registered nurse on call. Some assisted living facilities have memory care units for those with Alzheimer's or dementia, but services may vary.

### Skilled Nursing Facilities

Skilled nursing facilities are an option for seniors who need specialized 24-hour medical care and treatment from a registered nurse or therapy services from physical, speech or occupational therapists. A physician also supervises the patient's care. These facilities are hospital-like and provide short-term services for those who are recovering from an injury or illness, or long-term services for those who have a serious medical condition and need more extensive care. Staff are also there to assist with everyday activities and meals are offered in a common dining area for those who are able to be up and about. Memory care facilities are a specialized type of skilled nursing facility that accommodate seniors with Alzheimer's, dementia and other types of memory problems. They provide 24-hour supervised care in a comfortable and stress-free environment.

### Retirement Communities

Retirement communities encompass a wide range of housing options for seniors. These communities are designed for seniors who can still live independently. These include communities such as active adult communities, independent living communities and 55-plus communities. Seniors can choose from many housing options like single-family homes, condos or apartments. While each retirement community is unique, they often have a number of amenities and conveniences such as fitness centers, pools, golf courses, transportation and a restaurant on site. These communities allow seniors their independence and freedom while also offering convenient services to assist with housekeeping and meal preparation if needed. Many retirement communities also have an assisted living component.

Many verticals from technology, health care, trade and more are flocking to the area as it is one of the quickest growing areas for business in the country. The First Coast is a very affordable area for companies as there are no inventories on foreign income or corporate franchise taxes.

With the many business opportunities the First Coast has available, it is easy to see why more than 80 companies, five Fortune 1000 and three Fortune 500 companies have divisional or national headquarters in Northeast Florida. The city continues to rank as one of the best places for both careers and business, even cited by Wallethub as one of the best large cities to live. Besides being listed as the No. 1 city of talent attraction according to JAXUSA and Emsi, Jacksonville was also newly named the No. 2 best city for young professionals by Forbes.

Florida has more than 130 public-use airports and 20 commercial airports as well as 15 deep-water seaports that support trade between numerous world regions. Each year the seaports provide more than \$117 billion to the economy and 900,000 jobs throughout the state.

Jacksonville has emerged as a financial powerhouse known for its banks, investment services and insurance firms. The First Coast has more than 20 companies on the Forbes' Global 500 list. ## *Florida offers Sales and Use Tax Exemptions on:*

- Aircraft parts, modification, maintenance and repair, sale or lease of qualified aircraft
- Certain boiler fuels (including natural gas) used in the manufacturing process
- Commercial space activity—launch vehicles, payloads and fuel, machinery and equipment for production of items used exclusively at Spaceport Florida
- Electricity used in the manufacturing process
- Labor component of research and development expenditures
- Labor, parts and materials used in repair of and incorporated into machinery and equipment
- Machinery and equipment used by a new or expanding Florida business to manufacture, produce or process tangible personal property for sale
- Machinery and equipment used predominantly in research and development
- Production companies engaged in Florida in the production of motion pictures, made for television motion pictures, television series, commercial music videos or sound recordings
- Semiconductor, defense and space technology-based industry transactions involving manufacturing equipment.

## *Florida does not have:*

- Corporate franchise tax on capital stock
- Corporate income tax on limited partnerships
- Corporate income tax on subchapter S-corporations
- Property tax on business inventories
- Property tax on goods-in-transit for up to 180 days
- Sales and use tax on goods manufactured or produced in Florida for export outside the state
- Sales tax on purchases of raw materials incorporated in a final product for resale, including non-reusable containers or packaging
- Sales/use tax on co-generation of electricity
- State personal income tax guaranteed by constitutional provision

As the third largest military presence in the country, the area is home to more than 50,000 active-duty and civilian contractors stationed at the area's three naval bases: Naval Station Mayport, Naval Air Station Jacksonville and Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay. The First Coast is also home to Marine Corps Blount Island Command, Camp Blanding Army Base and the United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville. The local economic impact of the Navy generates more than \$10 billion annually. The job force is very open to veterans with many businesses being veteran owned as well as veteran employed. Annual events are held throughout the year to honor those who have served or serve such as the job fairs for veterans and the largest Veterans Day Parade in the state of Florida.

NS Mayport is one of the three major Navy Installations on the First Coast. It is home to the Navy's 4th Fleet and is the third largest naval facility in the continental U.S. The naval station's harbor can hold up to 34 ships and the facility covers more than 3,400 acres. The station's 8,000-foot runway can handle any type of Department of Defense aircraft. The airfield is operated and maintained by NS Mayport's Air Operations Department, which conducts more than 100,000 helicopter and fixed-wing flights each year. The NS Mayport Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department provides first-rate facilities, services, activities and recreational programs. Both active-duty and civilian contractors can enjoy the warm climate of the First Coast throughout the year with outdoor recreation available both on and off the base including fishing, boating, hiking and camping.

Situated on the St. Johns River on the Westside of Jacksonville, Naval Air Station Jacksonville (NAS Jacksonville) is the largest Navy base in the Southeast and third largest in the nation. NAS Jacksonville is home to almost 4,000 acres that encompass the area and is also an operational headquarters for more than 100 tenant commands. The annual regional impact of the base is a large part of the area's economy at \$2.1 billion. Home to the largest squadron in the Navy, the Patrol Squadron Thirty (VP-30), the Navy base received the 2012 Presidential Excellence Award and the 2013 Commander, Navy Installations Command Excellence Award. There are many major tenants on the base including the Naval Supply Fleet Logistics Center, Naval Hospital Jacksonville; Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southeast; Fleet Readiness Center Southeast; Navy Region Southeast; and the Commander. The base is also home to the Blue Angels who are world famous for their brave aerial maneuvers that can be seen yearly at the NAS Jacksonville Air Show.

**Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay**

Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay is located approximately 38 miles away from Jacksonville, adjacent to the city of St. Marys in Georgia. This base is the home port for the U.S. Navy Fleet ballistic missile nuclear submarines that are capable of being equipped with the Trident missile. The base covers more than 16,000 acres with 4,000 of those acres as protected wetlands. For those living on base, there are many programs offered by Morale, Welfare and Recreation including dining, childcare, bowling and a golf course. The major base commands include the Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic, Trident Refit Facility, Trident Training Facility, Submarine Group 10 and the Naval Submarine Support Center. Currently on the base there are eight Ohio-class submarines including two guided missiles and six ballistic missiles.

**United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville**

Located on six acres of land nearby to NS Mayport, the United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville is accountable for 40,000 square miles of ocean and island waterways. This spans 190 miles of coastline starting at Kings Bay, Georgia to Port Malabar, Florida and is the responsibility of Sector Jacksonville. As the sub-office to the Coast Guard's 7th District Headquarters in Miami, the Multi-Mission Mayport and Security Detachment Mayport are utilized as well as Station Cape Canaveral and Station Ponce de Leon Inlet. Since the U.S. President can transfer any or all assets of the Coast Guard to the Department of the Navy during times of war or conflict, the Coast Guard is considered a military service.

**Blount Island Command**

Operated by the logistics base of the Marine Corps located in Albany, Georgia, Blount Island Command is one of the latest U.S. bases built and is located in Jacksonville. The purpose of the base was not originally to act as a base but was created for maintenance operations for maritime ships making it a logistics base. Since this is a logistics base, it has more than 33 acres for storage and a 1,000-foot pier and maintenance operation area, as well as a slipway with space for five vessel berths. The base plans, coordinates and executes logistics procedures of ships that are used in various operations that have a military or humanitarian purpose.

**Camp Blanding Joint Training Center**

Located about 38 miles from Jacksonville, Camp Blanding Joint Training Center (CBJTC) in Starke, Florida is a 73,000 acre training center. It serves as a Continuity of Government site for the Governor and Executive Branch and a Continuity of Operations site for the Florida Division of Emergency Management for Joint Forces Headquarters-Florida. The base is also a logistical support base during emergency operations and is a joint reception, staging and onward integration site. Due to this, the Camp has been used for multiple federal homeland and overseas operations. As the premier domestic and combat training facility in the Southeastern U.S., the camp focuses on Unified Land Operations and offers training to Unified Action partners.

The First Coast's prime location, with access to waterways, interstates and railroads galore, establishes the region as a major player in the logistics and distribution game. More than 70 million consumers are a mere day's driving distance away and even international customers are receiving their goods faster than ever. With this, numerous logistics and distribution companies have decided to call the First Coast home, including AAGEX Freight Group, CEVA Logistics, Crowley Maritime Corporation, Landstar Shipping and Mediterranean Shipping Company.

## **PORTS**

### **JAXPORT**

Known as the "global gateway to Florida," Jacksonville Port Authority (JAXPORT) is comprised of three marine terminals, including Blount Island, Dames Point and Talleyrand. JAXPORT is the largest container port in Florida and one of the largest vehicle-handling ports in the U.S. Shippers can utilize the port to ship to 140 ports in 70 countries,

the 100 trucking firms or the 40 daily trains. The port is also home to the Carnival Ecstasy while other cruisers depart from there.

During the port's first quarter of the new fiscal year, JAXPORT was able to increase their container volumes five percent, totaling approximately 353,400 20-foot equivalent units. More than 185,513 vehicles have moved through JAXPORT as of February 2021, making this the

second busiest quarter in relation to vehicles in the port's history. The port is also nearing the completion of multiple growth projects in 2021. The city is also working to deepen the shipping channel from the Atlantic Ocean to the Dames Pointe Marine Terminal from 40 feet to 47 feet by 2023.

The Blount Island Marine Terminal is JAXPORT's largest facility, as well as one of the largest vehicle import/

export centers in the nation. It is also home to one of the highest weight-bearing capacity docks. Dames Point Marine has 5,002 linear feet of deep-water berths, as well as six new Panamax container cranes. Talleyrand Marine Terminal is run by the Jacksonville Port Terminal Railroad Inc. and mostly deals with breakbulk cargo, such as lumber, paper and steel, vehicles and liquid bulk commodities.



## Port of Fernandina

The Port of Fernandina currently provides terminal service to over 14 pulp and paper producers throughout Florida and the Southeast, as well as steel export services to steel companies with mills in the Southeast region. The port is undergoing its first maintenance dredging in 21 years, which will allow more large ships to use the facility. The Port of Fernandina also recently purchased the tugboat Fort Clinch, which will also increase the amount of cargo coming in and out of the port.

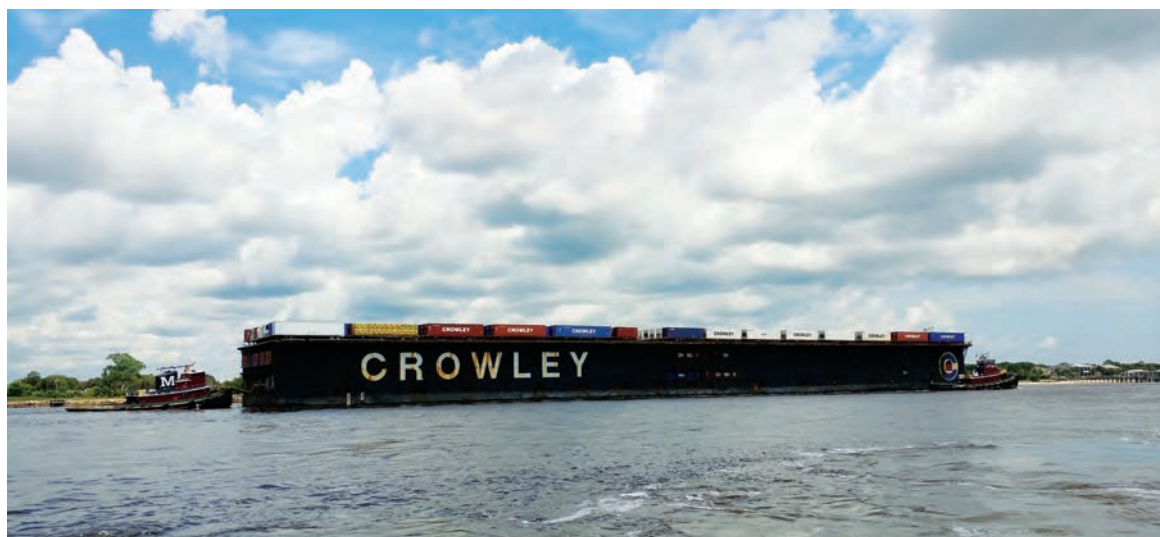

## TOLL ROADS

For the first time in over 30 years, the First Coast has toll roads and express lanes. Drivers who wish to use them will need to buy a SunPass or E-PASS. Drivers can use either pass for all state and local toll roads and express lanes.

E-PASS is run by the Central Florida Expressway Authority. The E-PASS sticker is free but must be loaded with \$10 to activate. E-PASS is available to purchase online, over the phone or at the E-PASS Service Center in Orlando.



## First Coast Expressway

The tolls on the First Coast Expressway are:

- I-10 to N. Argyle Forest Blvd.
- N. Argyle Forest Blvd. to Blanding Blvd.
- SR 21 to North of SR 16
- North of SR 16 to East of CR 209
- Shands Bridge to I-95

Those who do not pay the toll will be charged a toll-by-plate fee.

## I-295 Express Lanes

The express toll lanes on I-295 West stretch over 4 miles starting at I-95 to the Buckman Bridge. Drivers will only be charged a static toll of \$0.50 on weekdays from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Cash or toll-by-plate is not accepted in the express lanes. Express lane construction along I-295 from JTB to SR 9B is still ongoing.

## PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

### Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA)

JTA provides various mass transit services for the public in Duval County, including paratransit for the disabled and elderly, and Ride Request on-demand services.

**Bus** – JTA manages all bus services in the greater Jacksonville area. The JTA website features updated information about each route daily, including a specific time for each stop, making it more convenient than ever to take public transportation.

**Connexion (Paratransit)** – The paratransit service provides destination-to-destination shared transportation for disabled and disadvantaged individuals. JTA provides this service to supplement fixed bus routes around the city in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Connexion Plus is for eligible customers who want private, same-day, door-to-door service anywhere in Duval County.

**Park-n-Ride** – Created to make going to downtown Jacksonville a breeze, this coordinated JTA effort has designated lots around the city with express service to downtown. The Stadium Shuttle provides transportation to and from the stadium for major sporting events. These buses run continuously so whenever you're ready to leave, you will have a guaranteed ride back to your car.

**ReadiRide** – Offered by JTA through Owl Inc., ReadiRide is an on-call service that provides affordable transportation to customers in 11 communities. Download the MyJTA app for more information and payment options.

**Skyway** – This free automated train allows riders to glide high above traffic for convenient access around downtown Jacksonville. There are eight train stations and trains depart every four minutes during peak hours (6 to 9 a.m. and 4 to 7 p.m.) and every eight minutes during off-peak hours.

**Regional Services** – JTA partners with all neighboring counties to provide a seamless ride to your destination, even if that destination isn't in Duval County.

### Jacksonville International Airport (JAX)

The bustling Jacksonville International Airport (JAX) is Northeast Florida's only major airport and serves as the gateway to the First Coast region and neighboring areas. JAX provides non-stop flights to major U.S. airports, many of which go international. Only 12 miles from downtown Jacksonville,

the airport offers a variety of low-cost and legacy carriers for both business and leisure travelers. Airport amenities include free in-terminal Wi-Fi, live entertainment and artwork.

### Cecil Airport (VQQ)

Located approximately 15 miles west of downtown Jacksonville, Cecil Airport is a public joint civil-military airport and spaceport that services military aircraft, corporate aircraft, general aviation and air cargo.

This small-scale airport on Jacksonville's Westside is used for light sport and recreational flying, including skydiving, helicopters, glider airplanes and more. Additional services include flight training, aircraft sales and maintenance.

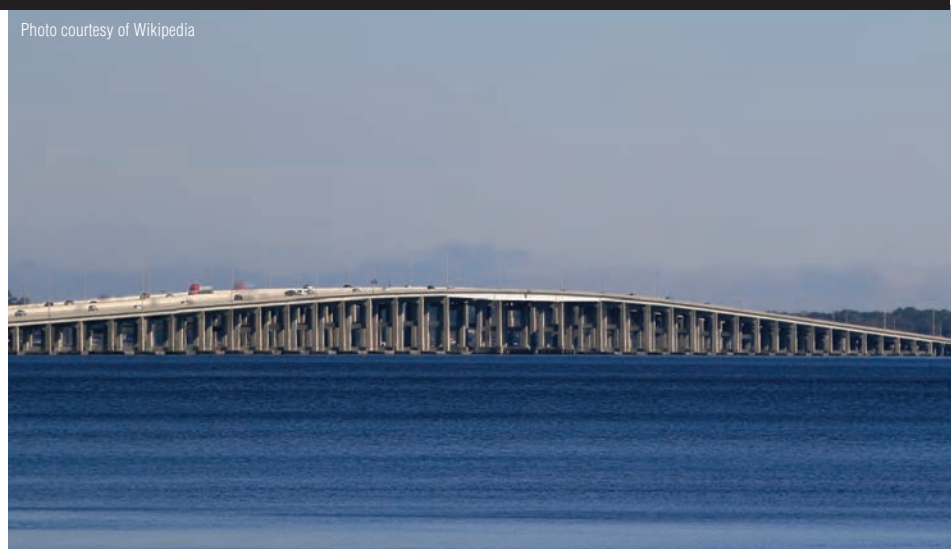

## **BEACHES**

### **DUVAL COUNTY**

#### **Atlantic Beach**

Whether you are looking to paddleboard, kayak, fish or surf, Atlantic Beach gives numerous options for the saltwater enthusiasts. Finish your beach day with a trip over to Atlantic Beach's bars, upscale restaurants and unique boutiques.

#### **Jacksonville Beach**

Situated between Neptune Beach and Ponte Vedra Beach, Jacksonville Beach, also known as Jax Beach, is one of the most popular beaches for vacationers, surfers and families. With public beach access and easily accessible parking, the area also boasts restaurants and bars. More than four miles long and covering 60

blocks along the Atlantic Ocean, Jax Beach is lined by small soft dunes and is a popular place for sea turtle nesting.

#### **Mayport**

The quaint fishing town of Mayport is north of Atlantic Beach at the mouth of the St. Johns River. The area is well known for its shrimping industry. Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park is the main beachfront where visitors can camp, fish and surf some of the best waves in Northeast Florida.

#### **Neptune Beach**

The charming beachside community of Neptune Beach is just a quick jaunt north of Jax Beach. While the beach is only about a mile long, visitors can enjoy surfing, relaxing on the white sand and taking quiet bike rides or

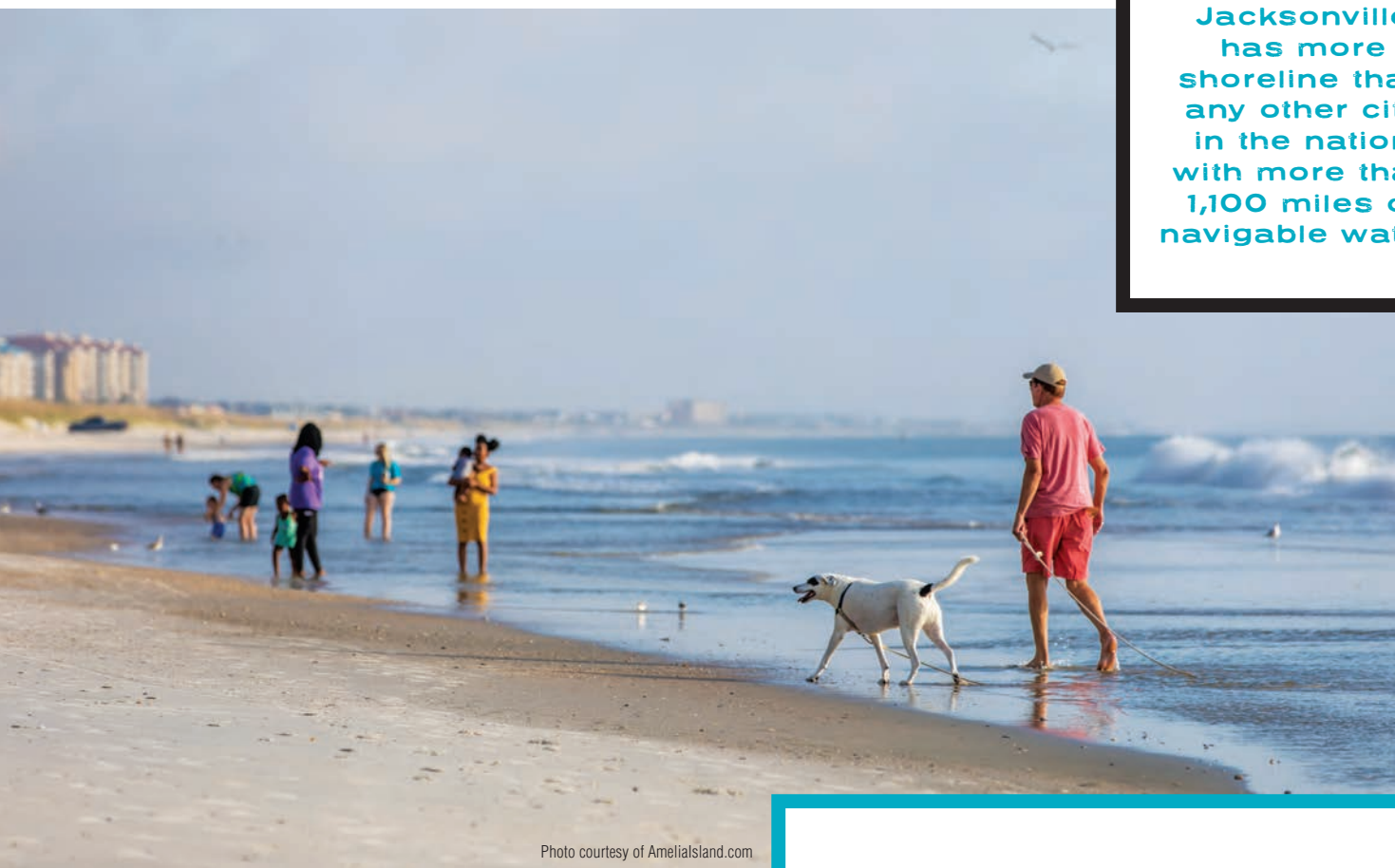

runs along the hard-packed sand. The Towncenter area of Neptune Beach is full of exceptional restaurants, coffee shops and boutiques.

## **NASSAU COUNTY**

### **Fernandina Beach**

Located on Amelia Island, Fernandina Beach is the northernmost beach on the First Coast. Known for its horseback riding along the beach and gorgeous sunsets and sunrises, the beach is perfect for any outdoor enthusiast. The area is also full of up-scale resorts and spas and boasts a quaint collection of bed and breakfasts.

## **ST. JOHNS COUNTY**

### **Crescent Beach**

South of St. Augustine on A1A, Crescent Beach is located on Anastasia Island. The area is named for the coastline's natural crescent shape. With many waterways scattered around the beach, the area is perfect for boating and fishing. The beach's hard-packed sand is ideal for bike rides, runs and horseback riding.

### **North Beach**

North Beach, located on A1A north of the Vilano Bridge, offers a highway walkover and a full range of facilities including boat ramps and parking. This beach is the perfect place for basking in the sun and enjoying the serenity of nature.

### **Ponte Vedra Beach**

Ponte Vedra Beach is a quick drive down the coast from Jacksonville. The beach is known for gorgeous sand dunes, which are more than 40 feet tall and some of the highest in Florida. The area is the perfect place for the outdoor enthusiast to hunt for shark's teeth and shells. The dog-friendly county beachside park, Mickler's Landing Beach, is a popular destination for beachgoers with easy access to fun in the sun.

### **St. Augustine Beach**

If you're looking for a fun day of sand and surf, head to St. Augustine Beach, which has a beachfront park, fishing pier, splash park, pavilion, oceanfront restaurants, beach volleyball courts and more.

### **Vilano Beach**

Located on the north side of the Matanzas Inlet, Vilano Beach has a dune walkover, showers, covered picnic tables, a pier and more. It is a great surfing, paddle boarding and skimboarding spot with a heavier surf and strong current found in the inlet. The beach does offer vehicle beach access but is restricted to four-wheel-drive vehicles and is available depending on conditions of the sand.

## WATERWAYS

### The Intracoastal

The Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway runs 40 miles throughout the First Coast. It splits the southside region of Jacksonville from the beach communities with its saltwater inlets, man-made canals and sounds. Opportunities to explore the area's natural beauty can be done with recreational vessels where various wildlife, shorebirds and flora can be found. It is common to see residents enjoying activities like kayaking, fishing, boating, paddle boarding, tubing and jet skiing.



### St. Johns River

The longest river in Florida runs right through our First Coast and is one of the few in the U.S. that flows north. The St. Johns River spans 310 miles from Mayport to Indian River County where residents can enjoy activities on the river such as kayaking, boating and fishing. The Riverwalk in downtown Jacksonville allows residents to stroll along the beautiful river. Keep your eyes peeled on the water because you may get a glimpse of some manatees or dolphins, which frequent the river.

### Other First Coast Rivers

Many bodies of water throughout the First Coast provide a multitude of outdoor fun like fishing and boating. The Tolomato and Guana rivers surround Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuary Research Reserve in St. Johns County, while in St. Augustine the Matanzas Bay and Matanzas River give sight to landmarks like the Castillo de San Marcos, St. Augustine Lighthouse and Bridge of Lions. On the Amelia River you can enjoy historic sites such as Fort Clinch State Park with radiant riverbanks and salt marshes.

## BAKER COUNTY

### John M. Bethea State Forest

Located in northern Baker County sits John M. Bethea State Forest with more than 37,000 acres. This serene piece of nature provides a wildlife passage between the Osceola National Forest and Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge.

### Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge

Known as one of the world's largest freshwater ecosystems, the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge covers more than 400,000 acres. Enjoy bike and hiking trails that weave through longleaf pines and hardwood hammocks where there is a chance you will see bobcats, wild turkey, black bears, alligators and more than 400 other creatures that live in the forests and swamps.

## Osceola National Forest

The Osceola National Forest is a true treasure for any wilderness explorer with camping, swimming, fishing, hiking and hunting.

## CLAY COUNTY

### Jennings State Forest

More than 15 biological communities can be found in the Jennings State Forest with sandhills, flatwoods, a dome swamp, blackwater stream, seepage stream and more. Many activities are available for visitors including fishing, camping, biking, horseback riding and hiking.

### Mike Roess Gold Head Branch State Park

Those looking to appreciate the serenity of nature can enjoy 2,000 acres of scrub, lakes, sandhills, marshes and ravines. The Florida National Scenic Trail runs through the park where visitors can enjoy a true shady oasis with golden grasses, beautiful trees and cool spring water perfect for canoeing, fishing or swimming.

## DUVAL-BEACHES

### Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park

Hanna Park visitors can enjoy camping, hiking and biking trails with 1.5 miles of gorgeous beaches. The 500-acre park is home to The Poles, Northeast Florida's best surfing spot, and the Kids Splash Park.

## DUVAL-NORTH

### Amelia Island State Park

Amelia Island State Park is an equestrian lover's dream with a beautiful beachside park perfect for horseback riding. The beach is a

treasure trove of seashells, along with many shorebirds and wildlife spotted throughout the park.

### Big Talbot Island State Park

Perfect for exploration, Boneyard Beach is home to "skeletons" of oak and cedar trees. The area is also well viewed by boat where many shorebirds can be spotted nesting in nearby trees and running along the edge of the water.

### Fort George Island Cultural State Park

Originally built in the 1920s as an ornate resort, the Ribault Club is now used as an event space and visitor



center in Fort George Island Cultural State Park. This lush island park is the perfect place for hiking, fishing, trail biking and boating.

### George Crady Bridge Fishing Pier State Park

This mile-long bridge is the perfect spot for those ready to spend the day and night fishing. The water is full of whiting, tarpon, jack and drum along with various other species throughout the year.

### Little Talbot State Park

Adjacent to Big Talbot Island, Little Talbot Island State Park has more than five miles of untouched salt marshes, magnificent white beaches and a variety of wildlife. Bring your binoculars along to spot bobcats, river otters, raccoons and both migratory and native birds. There are guided paddle tours available, kayak rentals and camping sites with full facilities.

### Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State Park

Animal lovers and equestrians will love Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State Park. The park has more than five miles of trails where hiking, horseback riding and walking are all

great activities. Keep your eyes peeled for Florida wildlife including squirrels, raccoons, various birds and more. The salt marsh is a relaxing way to enjoy the day in the water on kayaks or canoes.

### Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve

With more than 6,000 years of history tucked right into our own backyards, Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve was once home to the Timucuan tribe. It is home to the Kingsley Plantation and Fort Caroline, two historic sites on the First Coast. This is one of the last undisturbed coastal wetlands on the coast. Spend the day hiking through the cool woods or take in the beauty of the coastal dunes, hardwood hammocks and salt marshes.

## NASSAU COUNTY

### Cary State Forest

Expect to see some wildlife at Cary State Forest, where the flatwoods, basin marsh and sandhills are home to wood storks, gopher tortoises and the Sherman's fox squirrel which is found in longleaf pine and sandhill areas. Make sure to pack a picnic

lunch and enjoy a stroll taking in the beauty of the land.

### Four Creeks State Forest

Named after the four water systems located within more than 10,000 acres, this State forest has Boggy Creek, Plummer Creek, Thomas Creek and Alligator (Mills) Creek. With all of the water, fishing and kayaking are popular activities. Visitors can also hike the trails and bike throughout the area.

## ST. JOHNS COUNTY

### Anastasia State Park

More than 1,600 acres of pristine beaches, hammocks, tidal marshes and sand dunes make Anastasia State Park perfect for wildlife enthusiasts. Many wading birds can be spotted hunting for food and the chance of seeing a Bald Eagle is very high as they love to nest in the hammock forests. This area is also the location where coquina rock for the Castillo de San Marcos Fort was mined.

### Faver-Dykes State Park

Home to more than 100 species of birds, Faver-Dykes State Park is a birdwatchers paradise. The park

allows for camping, fishing, kayaking and canoeing on Pellicer Creek.

### Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve

Miles of scenic trails perfect for horseback riding, hiking and biking can be found on the 73,352-acre reserve. While enjoying outdoor activities visitors will see a variety of native wildlife including birds, squirrels and more. The coastal shrubbery and flatwoods are the ideal place for fishing, hunting and enjoying a day in the outdoors.

### Matanzas State Forest

As one of the last undisturbed salt marshes in the Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve, Matanzas State Forest covers 4,699 acres with 20 acres linked to the Moses Creek Conservation Area. The forest is managed for natural resources, ecological restoration, timber and wildlife. Visitors can spend the day hiking or biking on trails or enjoy the breeze on the water while kayaking, canoeing or fishing.

# ***First Coast Throwback: Historical Sites and Museums***

**The First Coast is a beautiful area filled with the perfect flora and fauna for a prosperous life. For more than 1,000 years, Northeast Florida was originally occupied by the Timucuan people who lived in various communities along the waterways. More than 35 different tribes lived in North and Central Florida, as well as southeastern Georgia. It appeared as if the culture was unchanged until the Europeans arrived. By 1800, the tribe disappeared due to settlers moving into their land.**

Two centuries later, the Spanish conquistador, Juan Ponce de León, landed on the banks of Northeast Florida and claimed the land he found for Spain. Motivated by the lush landscape, Ponce de León named the area *La Florida*. Led by French explorer, Jean Ribault, the French Huguenots claimed the land near the St. Johns River and traveled north to what is presently known

as South Carolina. The colony they established was not prosperous and failed. Ribault's second-in-command, René Goulaine de Laudonnière, took settlers from South Carolina back to Florida. In 1564, he founded Fort Caroline, but the next year the fort was destroyed by orders of the Spanish Governor of Florida, Pedro Menéndez de Avilés. These disasters led up to the celebration of a new city, St.

Augustine, which was originally the site of the Timucuan village, Seloy. The city was rebuilt several times after being attacked during wars. To keep the city of Havana, Spain gave a majority of their Florida territory to the British at the end of the Seven Years' War.

Starting in the late 18th century, the downtown area of Jacksonville was known as Cowford, mainly because

there was a place in the St. Johns River that was both shallow and narrow enough for cattle to cross. Eventually, the British colonists who settled the city changed the name to Jacksonville after Andrew Jackson, who would go on to become the seventh president of the United States. With a booming population of 17,201 in 1890, Jacksonville continued to be a popular city with



an increase to 57,699 residents by 1910. The St. Johns River became a large transporter of goods and passengers traveling upstream through the state, and downstream for coastal trading. The river also allowed access to the ocean to cross the sea, which assisted in facilitating commerce, enhanced security and recreation. The area began to become a prime vacation spot, with untouched beaches and warm weather. Resorts along the beach began popping up. This popularity also brought a drove of people looking to relocate and a population boom began.

Jacksonville's growth in the 20th century was attributed to the presence of the Navy bases in the area. This now includes Naval Air Station Jacksonville, Naval Station Mayport, King Bay Naval Base, Camp Blanding Joint Training Center, Naval Aviation Depot Jacksonville and Blount Island Command. These provide employment to thousands of active-duty, reserve and civilian residents of Northeast Florida.

The First Coast is full of a rich history of both celebrations and struggles but gives residents the chance to learn about how our area developed and continues to prosper.

The largest Civil War battle in Florida was fought on Feb. 20, 1864. Known as the Battle of Olustee, more than 10,000 cavalry, infantry and artillery troops fought for almost five hours. After 2,807 casualties were tallied, the Union retreated to Jacksonville. This battlefield became the first historic site in the state of Florida. Each February, a reenactment is held to honor those that were part of the battle.

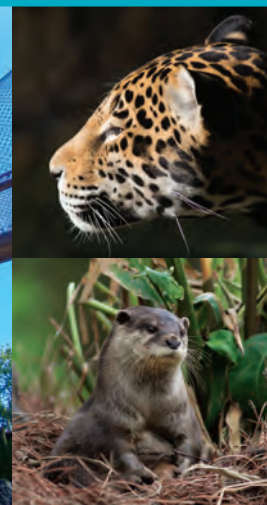

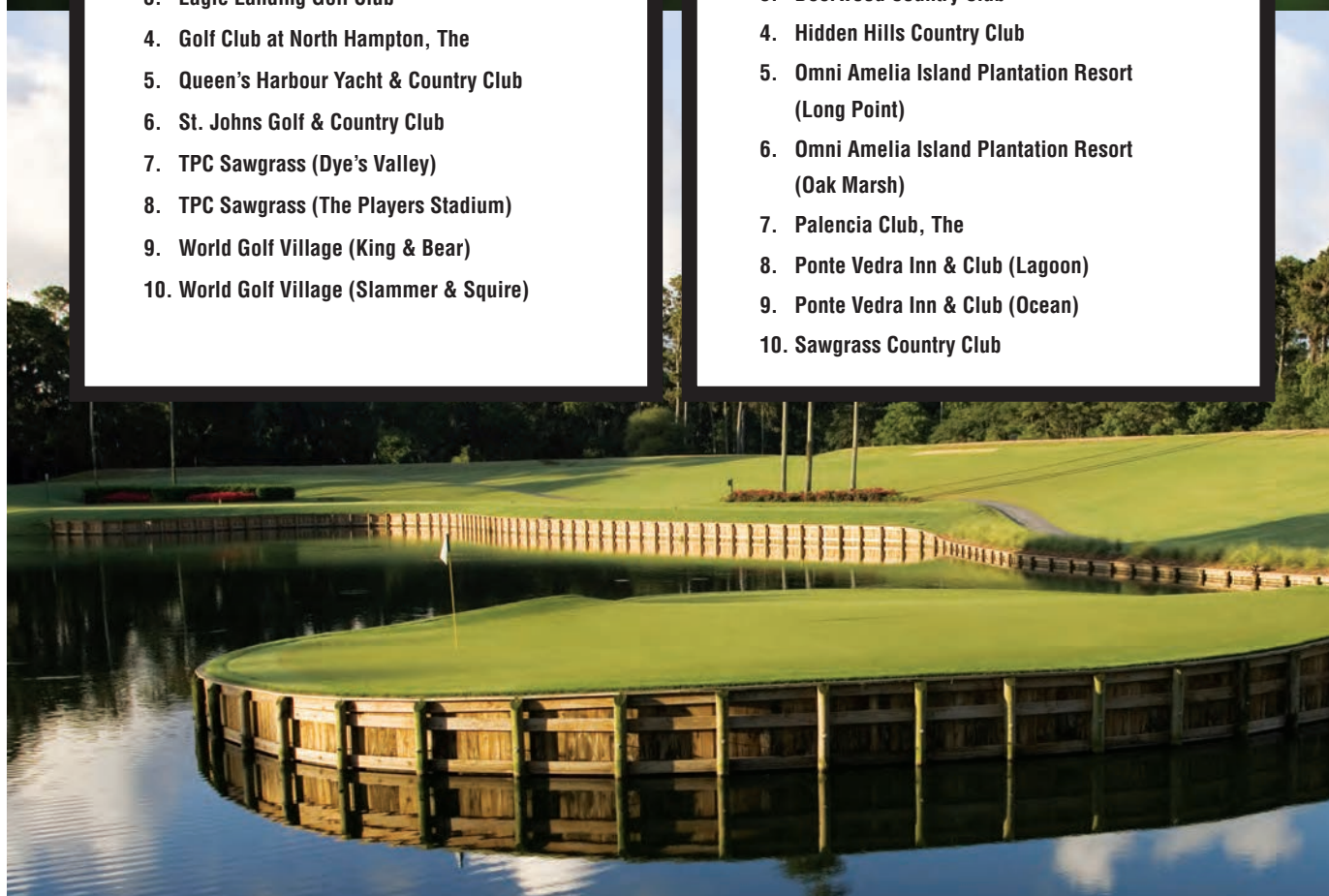
