



BAKER COUNTY

Downtown Jacksonville is a quick 30-minute drive, giving residents the ability to easily commute into town. Florida's natural beauty is preserved here through the county's lush woodlands and swamps that give residents endless opportunities to explore the outdoors.

GLEN ST. MARY/MACCLENNY

If country life is calling your name, **Glen St. Mary** and **Macclenny** could be the perfect places to call home. Whether you are looking for a single-family home, gated community or even a property with sprawling acreage, Glen St. Mary is an idyllic town. The city of Macclenny stands as the county seat of Baker County. The city has a population of about 7,300 residents and is 35 miles from Jacksonville and six miles from the Georgia border. This city provides residents with subdivisions that offer single-family homes, apartment complexes and townhomes.





CLAY COUNTY

Southwest of Jacksonville and west of historic St. Augustine, Clay County is a diverse mixture of suburban neighborhoods and up-and-coming communities. The area is a popular destination for nature lovers due to its scenic trails, immense wildlife and bountiful waterways.

FLEMING ISLAND

This thriving community continues to attract newcomers year after year. Fleming Island is home to major housing developments, including Eagle Harbor, Fleming Island Plantation and Pace Island.

Residents also enjoy access to a bustling commercial area filled with shopping centers, entertainment and restaurants. Black Creek Park, located on the south side of Fleming Island, borders Black Creek, and is full of nature trails for both hikers and bikers.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS

Originally established in 1854 as White Sulfur Springs, **Green Cove Springs** is a friendly city filled with rich history. Many historic homes can be found along the St. Johns River. Recently, the city has seen new housing developments pop up as the population grows.

Granary Park is a new 290-acre master-planned community in Green Cove Springs that consists of 771 single-family homesites. Located among green farmlands and rolling hills, the family-friendly community offers residents a variety of high-end amenities including a resort-inspired clubhouse, an oasis-style pool and a fitness studio.

Governors Park will be a new 3,300-acre master-planned community in Green Cove Springs from south Florida-based developer BTI Partners. The developer plans to build 4,000 single-family homes and 2,000 multi-family units, as well as an 18-hole golf course. The first

phase, known as Governors Park South, will consist of 401 homes across 235 acres.

Hyland Trail in Green Cove Springs is a new 750-acre master-planned community with approximately 1,500 residential single-family homesites. The neighborhood offers its residents access to a wide range of amenities, such as a clubhouse, fitness center, resort-style pool, playground, multipurpose athletic field, pickleball courts, nature trails and more.

Located near Lake Asbury, Lakes at Bella Lago offers 370 single-family homes with scenic views and modern designs. The stunning new lakeside community is ideal for families and individuals alike. Residents can enjoy the community's resort-style pool, clubhouse, walking trails and playground.

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS

The lakeside city of **Keystone Heights** is full of old-town charm.

Prospective residents will find tree-lined streets, cozy cottages, single-family homes and plenty of undeveloped land in this area located in the southwest corner of Clay County.

OAKLEAF PLANTATION

Oakleaf Plantation is a 6,400-acre family-oriented planned community with multiple village-style subdivisions situated in Clay County, with a small area falling into Duval County. The plantation offers newcomers single- and multi-family homes, luxury condominiums and apartments.

ORANGE PARK

Located in the northeastern section of Clay County, **Orange Park** offers all the advantages of big city living with a small-town pace of life. Housing options include everything from waterfront estates along the St. Johns River and Doctors Lake to new developments inland. The town is home to a variety of shopping areas, fine dining and live entertainment. Residents also have close access to I-295 and NAS Jacksonville.

MIDDLEBURG

Located near Black Creek in central Clay County, **Middleburg** has rapidly grown into a charming suburb that still retains its country roots. Residents have many housing options, including single-family homes and apartments.

DUVAL-SOUTH

INTRACOASTAL WEST

The Intracoastal West neighborhood is located west of the Intracoastal Waterway and north of John Turner Butler Boulevard (JTB), along Kernan Boulevard. 

The mandatory minimum coverage for a registered motor vehicle is a \$10,000 personal injury protection (PIP) policy and a \$10,000 property damage liability (PDL) policy. The minimum coverage applies to all vehicles registered in the state of Florida, even if the vehicle is inoperable. Visit www.flhsmv.gov/insurance for any further info.

Driver's License and Motor Vehicles

Within 10 days of becoming employed, placing a child in public school or establishing residency in Florida, vehicles registered out of state are required to be registered in Florida and have a Florida license plate, a registration certificate and a registration decal. You must apply for a Florida driver's license within 30 days of establishing residency in Florida to avoid fines and penalties. Visit www.flhsmv.gov for more info.

Property Taxes and Homestead Exemption

On the First Coast, property taxes are due in March and are considered delinquent as of April 1. Discounts are given for property taxes paid in advance. The maximum discount offered is 4 percent and applies to taxes paid in November. Late taxes are subject to penalty. Legal Florida residents who own and reside on property are eligible for a homestead exemption up to \$50,000. The first \$25,000 applies to all property taxes, including school district taxes. The additional exemption up to \$25,000 applies to the assessed value between \$50,000 and \$75,000 and only to non-school taxes. Florida's Amendment 5 went into effect this year and will give homeowners a tax break by adjusting part of your homestead exemption according to inflation.

To be eligible, you must own and occupy your home as your permanent residence on January 1. The deadline to file is March 1. To apply for the exemption, go to your local Property Appraiser's office. See our list of tax collector's offices on this page.

Termite Protection

First Coast homeowners need to be aware of the potential damage caused by termites, which are common throughout the state of Florida. Since your homeowner's insurance does not cover damage caused by termites, hiring a licensed pest control company to inspect and treat your home is recommended. To receive proper treatment, it's important to properly identify the type of termite that could possibly be infesting your home.

The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) regulates and licenses Florida's pest control industry. FDACS is authorized by law to conduct investigations to determine if any documented violations of the Florida Structural Pest Control Act (Chapter 482, Florida Statutes) or the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act have occurred. 

According to MMG's market snapshot, Jacksonville's rental market recorded strong rental demand through Q3 2024, with a net absorption of 5,638 units through the first three quarters of the year. The recent decline in construction starts is projected to support a gradual recovery of rental rates and occupancy rates leading into next year, with rent growth forecasted to rise above 2 percent by mid-2025.

The Southside submarket remains the leading region for apartment development on the First Coast, with 4,100 units opening their doors in the past year alone.

Due to historic levels of multifamily housing construction in the Jacksonville MSA, vacancy rates have almost tripled since 2021, according to projections from CoStar, the Florida Apartment Association's third-party real estate data company. Rent growth is expected to remain subdued in the coming months with an influx of new units being delivered leading to the already increased vacancy. Although construction starts have slowed, the additional supply coming online soon will likely dampen any expected rent increases as apartment demand is still expected to remain similar to 2024 levels.



Weather Prep

Storm Preparations

Being prepared with emergency supplies and a plan can help reduce the stress of an oncoming storm. Assemble a disaster supply kit, including a first aid kit and at least a three-day supply of food and water, and keep it in an easily accessible place. Items such as flashlights and a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) weather radio are helpful to stay up to date on comprehensive 24-hour weather forecasts. Keep a full tank of gas and plan multiple travel routes out of the area. Besides learning your evacuation zone, keep in mind that if an evacuation does occur, highways, bridges and roads may close.

Protect your home by boarding up glass doors or windows with plywood or installing hurricane shutters. Collect any loose objects from the yard, as they are a hazard and could fly away during high winds. The local emergency management or planning/zoning office can alert you if you live in a potential flood zone and give suggestions for additional preparation, such as getting sandbags to prevent water from getting into your house.

HURRICANES

Hurricane season begins in June and lasts until the end of November and, although most common during those months, hurricanes can form throughout the year. With three peninsulas, Florida gets the brunt of the storms on its coastlines, which are most threatened by these storms. As the most western point on the U.S. Eastern Seaboard, Northeast Florida receives fewer hurricanes than other parts of the state.

Weather Terms to Know:

Hurricane: winds 74 mph and above.

Hurricane Watch:

hurricane conditions are possible within 48 hours in or near the watch area.

Hurricane Warning:

hurricane conditions are expected within 36 hours in or near the warning area.

Tropical Depression: maximum sustained wind speed of 38 mph.

Tropical Disturbance:

originates in the tropics or subtropics and maintains an identity for 24 hours.

Tropical Storm: maximum sustained wind speeds of 39 to 73 mph.

Hurricane Categories:


The Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale is used by meteorologists to define a hurricane's category and determine safety measures that residents should take for hurricane preparation or even evacuation. This categorization scale doesn't determine other possible hurricane-related effects such as storm surge, tornadoes or flooding due to the increase of rain.

TORNADOES

Compared to the Midwest, tornadoes on the First Coast aren't nearly as strong but can still cause significant damage. Tornadoes can reach 300 mph with an average forward speed of 30 mph. If a tornado warning is issued, take shelter indoors away from the storm. When inside a building or home, stay away from windows in an inner room such as a bathroom or closet. Crouch low to the ground and cover your head with your hands. Stay aware of severe weather in the area, as tornadoes can develop quickly, and advanced warning isn't always possible.

Weather Terms to Know:

Tornado Warning: tornado sighted or indicated on radar.

Tornado Watch: tornadoes are possible in and near the watch area.

Waterspout: tornado that forms over warm water.



First Coast Early Learning and Voluntary Prekindergarten Resources

Florida was one of the first states in the country to offer free prekindergarten to all 4-year-olds, regardless of family income. Since the program began in 2005-06, more than 2.6 million children have benefited from the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program (VPK). According to the Florida Department of Education, children who attend VPK are more prepared for kindergarten than children who do not. The VPK Specialized Educational Services Program is available for families who have ageligible children with disabilities.



The St. Johns Ascension location is a Primary Stroke Center backed by leading cardiovascular, orthopaedic and surgical specialists, and offers a wide range of services for patients, including cancer care, cardiology care, obstetric and gynecological care, neurology care and more.

Encompass Health Rehabilitation Hospital of St. Augustine

This 40-bed rehabilitation hospital offers neurological, orthopaedic, stroke and spinal cord injury rehabilitation, among others. Patients have access to private rooms, a courtyard and advanced rehabilitation technologies. It is accredited by The Joint Commission.

UF Health Flagler Hospital

Located in St. Augustine, UF Health Flagler Hospital has been named among America's 50 Best hospitals. The 335-bed hospital has also earned the Gold Seal of ApprovalTM from The Joint Commission for primary stroke care centers, national accreditation for its total hip and total knee replacement programs, accreditation from the American College of Surgeons' Commission on Cancer, and Center of Excellence designation for its bariatric surgery center.

Healthcare on the First Coast is Flourishing!

The First Coast is experiencing a growth in economic and job opportunities that is unprecedented. These circumstances have set the stage for the healthcare industry to expand and thrive in a multitude of ways. As there is an increase in homeowners and residents within the area, the need for healthcare expansion to cater to a larger community is growing. Currently, there are a variety of developmental projects underway. This includes new hospitals, clinics and rehabilitation sites, along with healthcare industry collaborations, expanding facilities and new available treatment plans.

Acadia Healthcare

Acadia Healthcare is planning to build a new twostory, 144-bed behavioral hospital in St. Augustine. Located on 6 acres at CR 210 and I-95, the project is expected to be finished by the fourth quarter of 2025. Acadia Healthcare is a Tennessee-based behavioral healthcare service provider that offers inpatient, outpatient, detoxification and residential treatment.

Baptist Health

Baptist Health continues to grow and expand its presence on the First Coast. The health system recently opened the Baptist Emergency and Imaging Center at Nassau Crossing. The new center offers vital healthcare services to Yulee, Callahan and Hilliard residents. The ER features an adjoining imaging center for adults and children that offers X-rays, ultrasounds, CT scans, mammography and bone density screenings. The emergency and imaging center is the first facility to open on the new 56,588-square-foot Baptist Nassau Crossing Medical Campus. Once fully complete, the campus will offer primary care and behavioral health services and will be home to specialty physician offices, the Borland Groover Medical Office and Nassau Crossing Endoscopy Center.

Baptist Health plans to develop a medical campus in the Silverleaf community of St. Johns County. The proposed 118,000-square-foot project includes a freestanding 24/7 Baptist/Wolfson Children's Emergency Center, office space, a helipad for air ambulance services and space for future expansions. The campus is expected to open early in 2026. Baptist is also planning to build a two-story, 50,000-square-foot medical office building off Stillwood Pines Boulevard in Seven Pines.


North Florida Rehabilitation Hospital

The new \$48 million North Florida Rehabilitation Hospital is now open in west Jacksonville. Located at southwest Normandy Boulevard and Interstate 295, the 50-bed, 60,000-square-foot inpatient facility is the region's first free-standing inpatient rehabilitation hospital west of the St. Johns River. The rehab hospital is architecturally designed to create a therapeutic environment for patients and is equipped with cutting-edge amenities and adaptive units, including a 12-bed brain injury unit, multidisciplinary therapy gymnasiums, a specialized daily living activities suite and outdoor courtyards designed to promote patient mobility.

UF Health

To serve the healthcare needs of the growing North Jacksonville and Southeast Georgia communities, UF Health North has opened a new \$140 million, 124-room patient tower. The hospital tower includes six floors, two of which are dedicated to patients needing acute physical therapy. Two additional patient floors will be used for acute care, and one floor will be used primarily for ancillary services.

UF Health has broken ground at UF Health Durbin Park, a 42.5-acre health and wellness campus that will expand the healthcare options for residents in northeast St. Johns County. The project's first phase will include a full-service 150-bed hospital with a focus on orthopaedics, neurosurgery, cardiovascular medicine and women's services. The campus will also be home to a medical office building and an ambulatory surgery center. The project is expected to bring 2,000 new jobs to the area. Once fully complete, the 395,000-square-foot hospital will include acute, intensive and emergency care; operating rooms; and an imaging suite and hybrid labs for interventional procedures. The hospital is expecting to start treating patients by late 2025.

Staff members are trained to assist residents with tasks such as bathing. cooking, dressing, taking medication, shopping and more. Many of the facilities are structured like apartment buildings with a shared common space where many host social and recreational activities.

Skilled Nursing Facilities

Seniors in need of round-the-clock medical care may be best suited for skilled nursing facilities. These facilities are equipped to offer treatment from registered nurses, therapy services from physical, occupational or speech therapists, plus a physician on staff to supervise the patients' care. The facilities also offer short-term services for people recovering from an injury or illness, or long-term services requiring more

intensive care. Memory care facilities, a type of skilled nursing facility, specialize in caring for seniors with Alzheimer's, dementia and other memory-related issues.

Retirement Communities

Retirement communities are best for seniors who can live independently and don't require assistance with daily tasks from staff members. These communities include active adult communities, independent living communities and 55-plus communities. There are many different types of housing options like apartments, condos and single-family homes. Several communities will have amenities like gyms, pools, golf courses, transportation and food options on site. Some may also include housekeeping and meal prep services if needed.





Florida's tax environment is favorable for both businesses and individuals alike.

Florida Offers Sales and Use Tax Exemptions on:

- Aircraft parts, modification, maintenance and repair, sale or lease of qualified aircraft
- Certain boiler fuels (including natural gas) used in the manufacturing process
- Commercial space activity launch vehicles, payloads and fuel, machinery and equipment for production of items used exclusively at Spaceport Florida
- Electricity used in the manufacturing process
- Labor component of research and development expenditures
- Labor, parts and materials used in repair of and incorporated into machinery and equipment

- Machinery and equipment used by a new or expanding Florida business to manufacture, produce or process tangible personal property for sale
- Machinery and equipment used predominantly in research and development
- Production companies engaged in Florida in the production of motion pictures, made for television motion pictures, television series, commercial advertising, music videos or sound recordings
- Semiconductor, defense and space technology-based industry transactions involving manufacturing equipment

Florida does not have:

- · State-level property tax assessed

- Corporate income tax on subchapter S-corporations
- Corporate income tax on limited partnerships
- Corporate franchise tax on capital stock

as Project Bobcat, the new facility
will create 109 high-quality jobs.
Construction is scheduled to finish
around September 2025.

"By expanding our footprint into Jacksonville, we can better meet the burgeoning demand for cold and dry food service storage in the Southeast and revolutionize distribution support operations for our valued customers," Anderson-DuBose Chief Operating Officer Mike Boddy said in a JAXUSA news release. "Anderson-DuBose appreciates Norfolk Southern's commitment to this joint growth opportunity for both of our companies."



DHL Supply Chain Logistics and Distribution Center in North Jacksonville

Leader in contract logistics DHL Supply Chain plans to build a 600,000-square-foot facility in north Jacksonville that will create at least 100 new jobs by the end of 2025. DHL Supply Chain will invest \$64 million in the building and equipment for the new facility.

"We welcome DHL Supply Chain and thank them for choosing Jacksonville. Their new facility and the 100 jobs that will be created to support it are a reflection of our reputation as America's Logistics Center," Jacksonville Mayor Donna Deegan said in a JAXUSA news release. "We are proud to have the world's leading contract logistics provider expand its operations in our fast-growing city."

Hermeus Selects Jacksonville for New Hypersonic Aircraft Testing Facility

Atlanta-based high-tech aircraft developer Hermeus plans to open a new hypersonic engine testing facility at Cecil Airport on Jacksonville's Westside. Named HEAT (High Enthalpy Air-Breathing Test Facility), the facility will be Hermeus' largest and most technologically advanced test site to date and will become a national asset for hypersonic testing.

The new testing facility will evaluate hypersonic aircraft engines that will allow for transatlantic travel. These

hypersonic aircraft engines can reach five times the speed of sound and have the potential to offer a 90-minute flight from New York to London. Hermeus has invested \$130 million in the project and will bring in a total of 100 new high-wage jobs to the area by 2028.

Hermeus' Jacksonville site will be the company's fifth in the country for engine development and will include two engine test cells, an office building and a hush house (a noise-suppressed facility used for testing aircraft systems). "We're getting bigger, but we needed space to do that," said Glenn Case, Cofounder and Chief Technologist of Hermeus in a JAXUSA news release. "Florida was the right place to do it." change and demographic shifts. The approximately 500,000-square-foot facility is expected to open in 2026.


Primark Jacksonville Distribution Center

Primark plans to import cargo through the JAXPORT since the international trade seaport is strategically located within a one-day truck drive of nearly 100 million U.S. consumers. Through the opening of its new distribution center, Primark, in partnership with DHL and JZI, has created jobs for and invested in the Jacksonville community.

Publix Pharmaceutical Facility Coming to St. Johns County

Publix plans to establish an innovative pharmaceutical manufacturing facility in St. Johns County that will add approximately 115 jobs by the end of 2026 and 400 by the end of 2034. Anticipated to be operational in 2026, this \$145 million state-of-the-art central fill pharmaceutical facility will be located within the industrial park of Legend Point Logistics Crossing in St. Johns.

The central fill facility will process up to 500,000 orders per week and eventually reach 1 million per week. The facility's employees will assemble made-to-order prescriptions that are dispensed at Publix pharmacies after raw materials are unpacked and processed into salable form.



PORTS JAXPORT

The largest container port by volume in Florida and one of the nation's largest vehicle-handling ports, Jacksonville Port Authority (JAXPORT) is known as the global gateway to Florida, JAXPORT's international seaport offers global cargo service from dozens of ocean carriers, including direct service with Asia, Europe, Africa, South America, the Caribbean and other major markets. Comprised of three marine terminals, Blount Island, Dames Point and Talleyrand, shippers can utilize the port to ship to 140 ports in 70 countries via the 100 trucking firms or the 40 daily trains. In 2022. the Jacksonville Harbor Deepening Project was completed through Blount Island. The project deepened the Jacksonville shipping channel from 40 feet to 47 feet. The project included the construction of a vessel turning basin that now allows larger ships to turn around at Blount Island berths.

The Blount Island Marine Terminal is JAXPORT's largest marine facility, as well as one of the largest vehicle import/export centers in the U.S.
The Dames Point Marine Terminal has 5,002 linear feet of deep-

water berths, as well as six new
Panamax container cranes. Talleyrand
Marine Terminal mostly deals
with containerized and breakbulk
cargo, automobiles and liquid bulk
commodities.

Port of Fernandina

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) www.jtafla.com

JTA provides various mass transit services for the public in Duval County, including paratransit for the disabled and elderly, and Ride Request on-demand services.

Bus – JTA manages all bus services in the greater Jacksonville area. The JTA website features updated information about each route daily, including a specific time for each stop.

Connexion (Paratransit) - The paratransit service provides destination-to-destination shared transportation for disabled and disadvantaged individuals. JTA provides this service to supplement fixed bus routes around the city in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Connexion Plus is for eligible customers who want private, sameday, door-to-door service anywhere in Duval County. **Park-n-Ride** – Created to make going to downtown Jacksonville a breeze, this coordinated JTA effort has designated lots around the city with express service to downtown. The Stadium Shuttle provides transportation to and from the stadium for major sporting events.

ReadiRide - Offered by JTA through Owl Inc., ReadiRide is an on-call service that provides affordable transportation to customers in 15 Jacksonville communities. Download the MyJTA app for more information and payment options.

Skyway – This free automated train allows riders to glide high above traffic for convenient access around downtown Jacksonville. There are eight train stations, and trains depart every four minutes during peak hours (6 to 9 a.m. and 4 to 7 p.m.) and every eight minutes during off-peak hours.







BEACHES DUVAL COUNTY

Atlantic Beach

Duval County's northernmost beach community, Atlantic Beach offers a peaceful seaside atmosphere. The beach's historic fishing village, Mayport, is well-known for its shrimping industry. Located between Atlantic Beach and Mayport is the popular Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park. Here visitors can enjoy camping, fishing and surfing.

Jacksonville Beach

Nestled between Neptune and Ponte Vedra beaches, Jacksonville (Jax) Beach spans 60 blocks along the Atlantic Ocean. Jax Beach offers public access in multiple locations and is the perfect spot for surfing. The Jax Beach pier is a great place for anglers to catch fish.

Neptune Beach

Located north of Jax Beach, this mile-long beach gives residents and visitors a chance to bike, bask in the sun and surf.

NASSAU COUNTY

Fernandina Beach

As the First Coast's northernmost beach, Fernandina Beach is the perfect place for seashell hunting and is known for its horseback riding tours that give visitors and residents a chance to experience the beach from a whole new perspective.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Crescent Beach

Located south of St. Augustine on Anastasia Island, Crescent Beach is named from the crescent shape of its coastline. The beach's hardpacked sand is perfect for bike riding, horseback riding or beach volleyball.



North Beach

North Beach is a serene spot just north of the Vilano Bridge on A1A. A full range of facilities are available, including boat ramps, showers and public parking.

Ponte Vedra Beach

This low-key beach located just south of Jax Beach has many access points for beachgoers and is the perfect place to hunt for seashells and shark teeth. Mickler's Landing is tucked into the southern part of Ponte Vedra Beach and is known as a popular destination for surfers and families.

St. Augustine Beach

St. Augustine Beach has everything for a fun-filled beach day, including a fishing pier, pavilion, splash park and beach volleyball courts.

Vilano Beach

Vilano Beach is located on the north side of the Matanzas Inlet and has a dune walkover and access for four-wheel-drive vehicles. Its location on the coast gives it a stronger current, making it popular for surfing, paddleboarding and skim boarding.

WATERWAYS

The Intracoastal

Dividing Jacksonville's Southside region from the beach, the Intracoastal Waterway runs about 40 miles through the First Coast. It has a variety of saltwater inlets, sounds and man-made canals, which are open to recreational vessels.

St. Johns River

Florida's longest river runs right through the First Coast, spanning 310 miles from Mayport to Indian River County. Residents can enjoy many activities on the river, such as kayaking, boating and fishing. The Riverwalk in downtown Jacksonville allows residents to take a stroll or jog along the beautiful river. Keep your eyes peeled for manatees or dolphins, which frequent the river.

Other First Coast Rivers

Other First Coast rivers provide for fishing, boating and other outdoor activities throughout the year. In St. Johns County, the Guana and

Tolomato rivers surround the Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuary Research Reserve. On the Amelia River, boaters can take in the historic sights of Fort Clinch State Park. In St. Augustine, take a ride on the Matanzas Bay and Matanzas River to see the Bridge of Lions, St. Augustine Lighthouse and Castillo de San Marcos.

The Great Outdoors:

State Parks & Preserves

While the hustle and bustle of the First Coast is great and exciting, few things compare to the peace of nature. The First Coast is home to 80,000 acres of parks, including nine state parks, a national forest and national wildlife refuge. Enjoy a walk through beautiful gardens and nature preserves, or spend some time at one of the more than 400 urban parks. Many of the parks and preserves have options for water activities like fishing or canoeing and trails for biking, walking or horseback riding.



BAKER COUNTY

John M. Bethea State Forest

On more than 37,000 acres, the John M. Bethea State Forest houses a plethora of animals, including bald eagles, black bears, white-tailed deer and the ever-present alligators. There is also a seven-mile horse loop, areas open for fishing and hunting and three miles of the St. Johns River for a scenic river hike.

Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge

With more than 400,000 acres of land, it's no surprise that the refuge is home to over 400 species of wildlife. While the refuge is mainly located in Georgia, a portion of the land claims space in Baker County. The area is a great location for camping, hiking and boating.

Osceola National Forest

The Osceola National Forest is perfect for those looking to hunt, hike, camp or fish. The 237,000 acres of flatwoods and swamps has plenty of options for every type of adventurer.

CLAY COUNTY

Jennings State Forest

In northern Clay County, Jennings State Forest gives visitors the chance to experience several different ecosystems, hike or bike along trails, fish or go horseback riding. The forest is over 25,300 acres and has several recreational areas.

Mike Roess Gold Head Branch State Park

In the 1930s, this 600-acre area was established as one of Florida's first state parks. The rolling sandhills, ravines, springs and other ecosystems offer a wide array of activities like canoeing, swimming and hiking.

DUVAL-BEACHES

Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park

With a mile and a half of gorgeous beaches, a 60-acre lake and over 20 miles of hiking and biking trails, Hanna Park is perfect for a day outside. Visitors can also spot some local wildlife, including alligators, foxes and various birds. Sea turtle nesting is from May to October.

DUVAL-NORTH

Amelia Island State Park

Containing picturesque beaches, salty marshes and magnificent forests, this state park is great for anyone looking to go horseback riding or wanting to search for shark teeth and shells while walking along the white sandy beach.

Big Talbot Island State Park

Home to Boneyard Beach, aptly named due to the skeletons of live oak and cedar trees that once grew along the shoreline, Big Talbot Island is a beautiful beach with hiking trails that lead to the shore, marsh and maritime forest.

Fort George Island Cultural State Park

Originally home to a fort of the same name, this state park is now a beautiful destination for people wanting to spend some time on the water boating or fishing or enjoy a hike around the island. The Ribault Club is a lovingly restored museum and event venue that highlights the history and beauty of Fort George Island.

George Crady Bridge Fishing Pier State Park

Head to one of the best fishing areas on the First Coast with this mile-long, pedestrian-only bridge that leads to a variety of fish such as tarpon, whiting, jake and drum.

Little Talbot Island State Park

Made up of five miles of untouched beaches and three miles of biking trails, Little Talbot Island is one of the last barrier islands on the First Coast. Camping, kayak rentals and paddle tours are available for visitors.

Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State Park

Threatened and endangered species like the American alligator and wood stork, respectively, and various other flora and fauna call the state park home due to the protective nature of the longleaf pine flatwoods. Visitors can bike, hike or ride horses along the more than 15 miles of trails.

Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve

Merging history with nature, this preserve is home to a variety of plants and animals, as well as Fort Caroline and the Kingsley Plantation. Within the 46,000 acres, visitors will find the St. Johns River, multiple tributaries, wetlands, dunes, hardwood hammocks and salt marshes. For those interested in the history of the area, including that of the Timucua people who lived here for thousands of years, monuments and historical structures can be found along the hiking trails.

NASSAU COUNTY

Cary State Forest

Established in 1937 as Florida's second state forest, Cary State is comprised of 11 ecosystems and is home to endangered and threatened species such as the gopher tortoise, Sherman's fox squirrel and wood stork. Visitors can camp, hike, hunt or go horseback riding within the forest.

Four Creeks State Forest

Aptly named for the four water systems located within the over 10,000 acres, Boggy, Plummer, Thomas and Alligator (Mills), Four Creeks State Forest is a great spot for water-based activities such as kayaking and fishing.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Anastasia State Park

With over 1,600 acres of beaches, sand dunes, marshes and hammocks, this state park offers space for an array of activities like camping, biking, bird-watching and more.

Faver-Dykes State Park

Nature lovers can find reprieve at this state park, which is home to more than 100 species of native and migratory birds, creeks, tidal marshes and

forests. Faver-Dykes is a great place for camping and various water-related activities.

Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve

This connection of freshwater and saltwater mixes, thus creating a unique and diverse habitat for several species. This estuary is one of 30 in the nation and is comprised of over 76,000 acres of land, with nine miles of trails and places for fishing and kayaking.

Matanzas State Forest

Home to the last undisturbed salt marshes on the Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve, this state forest is home to a variety of species, such as bald eagles, deer, otters, hogs and songbirds. Visitors can explore the area in a myriad of ways, including hiking, biking, kayaking and horseback riding.



Living on the First Coast comes with many benefits. The picturesque beaches, thriving job market and plethora of opportunities for a fun day out are all huge draws to the area. However, these are just a small part of what makes the First Coast amazing. Its history is filled with battles, struggles over land occupation, and the kind of perseverance that shows exactly why the area is continuing to grow daily.

A Step Back in Time: **Historical Sites & Museums**

In the beginning, the Timucuan tribes populated the area, making their homes along the waterways in northern and central Florida, as well as southeastern Georgia. For more than 1,000 years, they lived and thrived in the region. At the Timucuan Ecological and Historical Preserve, archeologists have discovered some of the oldest pottery in the U.S., dating back to 2500 B.C.

One of the most famous residents of the First Coast, Juan Ponce de León, a Spanish conquistador, landed on the banks of Northeast Florida and claimed the land for Spain in 1513. He called the region La Florida because of the jaw-dropping landscape.

Several decades later, in 1562, the French Huguenots, led by Jean Ribault, claimed land near the St. Johns River and traveled north to South Carolina to establish a colony. However, this colony ended in failure and a return trip to Florida. This trip was led by René Goulaine de Laudonnière, the founder of Fort Caroline. In 1565, just a year after it was established, the fort was destroyed on orders from Pedro Menéndez de Avilés, the Spanish governor of Florida.

Disaster after disaster for the French led to the creation of St. Augustine, formerly the Timucuan village Seloy. St. Augustine has been rebuilt numerous times after being attacked during various wars. At the end of the French and Indian War, most of the Spain's Florida territory was given to the British in a trade to keep the city of Havana.

After the end of the Revolutionary War in 1783, Britain returned control of Florida to the Spanish as outlined in the Peace of Paris, which was a set of treaties that ended the war and British control over the U.S. colonies.

In 1821, Spain sold the territory to the United States. The next year, Cowford, originally named for the shallow and narrow part of the St. Johns River that was perfect for cattle to cross, was renamed Jacksonville for General Andrew Jackson, who later became the seventh president of the U.S.

From 1890 to 1910, Jacksonville's population grew from 17,201 to 57,699 residents. As the city became more popular, the area became a major vacation destination and, due to the warm weather and beautiful landscape, was used as the

"Winter Film Capital of the World." The St. Johns
River became a large transporter of goods and
passengers, opening up travel and commerce
options. The growing Naval bases also contributed to
the rise in population. This only drove more people
to the First Coast, starting it on a path to its current
popularity and importance in numerous sectors.

BAKER COUNTY

Olustee Battlefield Historic State Park 5815 Battlefield Trail Rd., Olustee www.floridastateparks.org

For five hours on Feb. 20, 1864, cavalry, infantry and artillery troops totaling more than 10,000 fought in the largest Civil War battle in Florida, known as the Battle of Olustee. The battle ended with a Union retreat to Jacksonville and 2,807 casualties. The state park pays tribute to the battle, and each February, volunteers honor those who fought in the battle with a reenactment. Scenes from the film "Glory" were filmed during one such reenactment.

Heritage Park Village is comprised of 20 small museums that celebrate Baker County's history. The village includes a trading post, jail, train depot and chapel. The site also includes the Burnsed Blockhouse, the last in the state, which was used as a defensive structure.

CLAY COUNTY

Clay County's rich history is preserved at the Clay County Historic Museum & Triangle. Visitors can see the many exhibits that cover the everyday life of residents through personal letters, photos, furniture and clothes. The Triangle includes the 1890 courthouse, haunted jail and a veterans memorial monument.

Established in 1564, the Fort Caroline National Memorial pays tribute to the brief French Huguenot presence in the 16th century. Visitors can tour the replica of the fort or venture into the Timucuan Preserve.

As the only silent film studio complex on the First Coast, Norman Studios is a callback to the days when the area was used as the "Winter Film Capital of the World."

Ribault Club, The 11241 Fort George Rd., Jacksonville www.theribaultclub.com

Originally meant as a getaway for affluent families, The Ribault Club now serves as a museum for the history of Fort George Island.

Yellow Bluff Fort Historic State Park New Berlin Rd., Jacksonville www.floridastateparks.org

Despite its name, Yellow Bluff Fort was an armed encampment that served as an access point to inland Florida during the Civil War for both Union and Confederate troops. At its peak, it housed more than 250 soldiers.

Filled with Porsche racecars from as far back as 1953, auto memorabilia and stories, the Brumos Collection is a beautiful collection worth seeing for any automobile fan.

With over 20 interactive exhibits, kids between 1 and 12 can enjoy hands-on learning intended to develop their cognitive, social and physical abilities.

Made up of multiple buildings, permanent and temporary exhibits, the Mandarin Museum and Historical Society highlights the history and culture of the Mandarin area. Visit the St. Joseph's Mission Schoolhouse for African American Children or take a moment to learn about abolitionist and author Harriet Beecher Stowe.

Museum of Science & History (MOSH) 1025 Museum Cir., Jacksonville www.themosh.org

Fun for visitors of all ages, MOSH is comprised of numerous interactive and educational exhibits, the Bryan-Gooding Planetarium, the Hixon Native Plant Courtvard and many more areas to explore. The City of Jacksonville has approved funds to start construction on the new Northbank location.

DUVAL-WEST

Camp Milton Historic Preserve 1175 Halsema Rd. N., Jacksonville www.timucuanparks.org

Civil War artifacts, reenactments, an 1800s farmstead and an education center can be found at Camp Milton, a former Civil War encampment.

Durkeeville Historical Society & Museum 1293 W. 19th St., Jacksonville

During the Jim Crow era, Durkeeville served as a community for African Americans. The museum includes artifacts and exhibits covering that period of racial segregation.

Clara White, former slave, and Eartha White, humanitarian, served food to and sheltered those in need beginning in the 1880s. This museum commemorates their selfless efforts towards reducing and preventing homelessness and hunger, a mission that is continued today.

Visit the USS Orleck and the floating naval museum that honors the U.S. Navv and their efforts in the Cold, Vietnam and Korean wars.

Experience early 1900s middle-class life with a tour at the Merrill House Museum, a fully furnished Queen Anne-Eastlake Victorian home.

Acting as a working venue and museum, the Ritz honors the LaVilla neighborhood, also referred to as the "Harlem of the South." Visitors can attend shows or enjoy learning about part of Jacksonville's history from the 1920s to the 1960s, including a permanent exhibit honoring John Rosamond and James Weldon Johnson, who wrote the African American National Anthem, "Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing."

Veterans Memorial Wall 1145 E. Adams St., Jacksonville www.jacksonville.gov

Created to honor the more than 1,700 fallen heroes from World War I to the War on Terror, it was first dedicated to veterans from all military branches in 1995 and rededicated on its 20th anniversary in 2015. This memorial is the second largest veterans memorial wall in the nation.


